- The NHS is facing its most difficult financial challenge since its inception.
- The is general agreement that there will be a 30 billion short by about 2020
- Mental health services
  disproportionately hit 2%
  disinvestment over last two years with
  differential deflators applied which
  favour physical health providers



- Recessions are not good for any Nations mental health-so increased demand made worse by demographics changes
- In the English NHS one could argue this has been compounded by significant structural change



- North West London is a whole system integration pilot sight—involving Commissioners ,Local Government ,providers ,local people ,service users primary care NGOs.
- Centre of approach is co-production based on conversations about different ways of developing outcomes (with less resource)



- Services coming together based on what is needed by the individual not the available organisations.
- Early adopters are focusing on Long term conditions and serious mental illness ,cancer ,dementia-primary care providers ,acute care provider's , Mental health provider's service users
- Looking at new ways of working together, new ways of contracting new ways of funding



- System leaders-being able to focus beyond your organisation's boundaries
- Clinically lead pathways
- Difficult conversations with local people/service users about what they want and how they want it delivered
