Name of Match: Indigenous Leaders - Wharerātā

Location of Match: Christchurch

We would like to see the Wharerata Declaration be implemented into all Kaupapa Māori organisations and do embed the declaration using the themes.

Theme 1, Indigeneity, Reclaiming and sustaining.

Theme 2- Best Practice that is Informed practice.

Theme 3- Best evidence with credibility.

Theme 4-Indigenous leadership that build our indigenous youth to deliver best services for our people for years to come.

The acceptance of cultural healing process and different ways to evidence the work we do to be recognised as "Best practice". We may not have the large-scale studies, but we know that the outcomes are best for our people and these outcomes need to be recognised. Our presenters were all solution focused not deficit focussed as we already know the solutions to the issues our communities are facing

Discussions around Hua Oranga, the outcomes framework to be embedded into Kaupapa Māori organizations for all delivery contracts under mental health and addictions. We should be delivering services to our people instead of money being given to larger nonindigenous organisations to deliver these services when we already exist

Whanau Ora to be fully supported (funding and contractually) by Te Aka Whaiora and Te Whatu Ora.

Wednesdays roopu. Outcome to write to Te Aka Whaiora in response to Wharerata Declaration.
