The match was for leaders, funders and people with lived experience interested in developing, or with experience of developing peer led acute alternative services. The host organisations have developed three successful services in New Zealand over the last 13 years and are keen to share successes, challenges and ideas for development of similar models and services. A formal evaluation on the efficacy of these models is currently being developed by the University of Auckland. Discussion involved strategies to get decision-maker and funder "buy-in", tips and ideas from concept to design to implementation to outcome, lessons learned and how models have been adapted over time.
